DAKOTA LANGUAGE

Owámniyomni, known in English as St. Anthony Falls, translates to "turbulent waters" in the Dakota language. Okhódayapi means "to be friends with, to be friendly, to befriend." The name Owámniyomni Okhódayapi uplifts Dakota language and makes visible the fact that the Falls - and all of the area we call Minneapolis - are Dakota homelands. Owámniyomni Okhódayapi is a Dakota-led non-profit organization with a Native American-majority board of directors.

LOGO DESIGN

The Owámniyomni Okhódayapi logo was designed by artist Rochelle Lame Bull, a member of the Lower Sioux Indian Community, in consultation with graphic designer Brian Skeet. Lame Bull captured the falling water of Owámniyomni, its relationship to the downtown Minneapolis skyline, and our respect for plant and animal relatives. The plant shown on the upper right represents Phežíhota (Sage) and bottom left represents Psíŋ (Wild Rice).

CORRECT LOGO USAGE

It is important to maintain the integrity and consistency of the Owámniyomni Okhódayapi identity. The identity must always be presented in a clear and legible manner. The identity must always be reproduced from the approved files, and any alterations to the identity are strictly forbidden Additional factors to consider when using the identity include colors, backgrounds and the clear zone. Although not an exhaustive list, this page illustrates common incorrect uses of the identity.




DO NOT PLACE THE LOGO ON A PATTERN.

COLOR PALETTE

The identity should be printed in the approved Owámniyomni Okhódayapi colors. The Owámniyomni Okhódayapi colors were chosen to complement our brand personality. The CMYK colors are the preferred color combinations for all the colors chosen. Use only web safe colors for web text.



WAVE ELEMENT






LOGO ELEMENTS
